## II. DEVELOPMENTS OF NOTE

- District of Columbia: A police officer was struck by a Metrobus in pursuit of a suspect between L Street and Bladensburg Road NE this morning. The officer suffered significant injuries. All travel lanes are open.
- Montgomery County: Fire and Rescue responded to a two-vehicle collision on Montgomery Village Avenue/MD-124 and Christopher Avenue in Gaithersburg last night. Two patients were evaluated with non-lifethreatening injuries. All travel lanes are open.

## III. COVID-19 (CORONAVIRUS)

- Overview: Johns Hopkins University reports 4,362,996 COVID-19 cases, 297,465 deaths, and 1,558,462 recoveries worldwide as of 6:15AM. In the US, there are 1,390,764 cases, 84,136 deaths, and 243,430 recoveries.
- National Capital Region: There are 41,046
  COVID-19 cases and 1,724 fatalities reported
  in the NCR. <u>DC</u>, <u>MD</u>, <u>VA</u>
- Nationwide: <u>Uber</u> drivers and riders must confirm via a new "Go Online Checklist" that certain COVID-19 safety measures were taken.
- Maryland: On Friday, May 15 at 5PM, the state will move from Stay at Home order to a <u>Safer at Home</u> public health advisory. Certain businesses and facilities can open, subject to local regulation.
- District of Columbia: The District's public health emergency and <u>Stay At Home Order</u> were extended through June 8. The order also mandated all individuals wear masks or face coverings during essential business and travel.
- District of Columbia: Residents participating in the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) may use their Electronic Benefits Transfer (EBT) card to buy groceries through <u>Amazon</u>.
- Prince George's County: At 11AM, the County Executive will hold a <u>press conference</u> on COVID-19 response and future steps.
- Montgomery County: The County will remain on a Stay at Home <u>status</u> until local COVID-19 data dictates it is safe to move toward reopening. All summer camps and programs are <u>canceled</u>, and plans for new camps in a COVID-19 environment are being developed.
- Prince William County: Two new COVID-19 drive-thru testing <u>sites</u> will open Friday, May 15 in Walmart parking lots by appointment only.
