II. DEVELOPMENTS OF NOTE

National Capital Region

 Prince George's County: Police responded to Pennsylvania Ave and Forestville Rd for a fatal hit-and-run. When officers arrived on scene, they found an unresponsive male. The striking vehicle that left the scene is described as white sedan with front end damage and missing a driver side mirror. Link

 Montgomery County: Tolling system upgrades will continue on the Intercounty Connector (ICC) with detours this weekend. Traffic will be detoured at Layhill Rd (MD-182). The detour will direct motorists north on Layhill Rd to west on Norbeck Rd and north on Georgia Ave (MD-97) back to westbound ICC/MD 200. Link Charles County: Detectives made two
additional arrests in the shooting death of
Bradley Alan Brown, the son of a Prince
George's County police officer. Both suspects
were charged with first-degree murder.
Detectives believe robbery was the motive in
this case. The investigation is ongoing, and

United States

 New Jersey: The state's Office of Homeland Security and Preparedness released the 13th Annual Terrorism Threat Assessment. The threat level for white supremacist extremists was raised to high, the topmost category for threat levels for any extremist group, after the group was identified as the largest terrorist threat in the state last year. <u>Link</u>

III. COVID-19 (Coronavirus)

- Overview: Johns Hopkins University's Center for Systems Science and Engineering reports 77,662 confirmed cases of COVID-19 and 2,360 deaths as of 2/22/2020 at 6AM. Link
- Nebraska: The CDC verified test results completed by the Nebraska Public Health on the 13 individuals who are former passengers of the Diamond Princess cruise ship. Eleven of the 13 passengers have tested positive for COVID-19. Ten people are currently in the National Quarantine Unit and three are in the Nebraska Biocontainment Unit. Most of the patients aren't showing symptoms and some are exhibiting minor symptoms. Link
- Lebanon: The World Health Organization (WHO) Lebanon Office confirmed the first COVID-19. The 45-year-old patient arrived from Iran. She is currently in a negative pressure isolation ward and stable. Link
