


# NCR WATCH DESK

#### I. WEATHER

 Today: Scattered showers before noon, thunderstorms between noon and after 2PM.
Chance of precipitation is 60%. High 83°. Low 67°.



 Hazardous Weather Outlook: Isolated instances of flooding are possible from locally heavy rain this afternoon and evening.

### **National Capital Region**

## III. COVID-19 (CORONAVIRUS)

- Overview: Johns Hopkins University reports 8,507,721 COVID-19 cases, 454,230 deaths, and 4,174,429 recoveries worldwide as of 6AM. In the US, there are 2,191,200 cases, 118,435 deaths, and 599,115 recoveries.
- National Capital Region: There are 75,390 COVID-19 cases and 2,862 fatalities reported in the NCR. DC, MD, VA
- Maryland: The Department of Health officials urged county leaders to step up local COVID-19 testing efforts and meet the goal of testing 10 percent of their populations. The state will soon begin publishing testing volume data by jurisdictions on coronavirus.maryland.gov so Marylanders can track local progress.
- Montgomery County: Phase Two of reopening begins today at 5PM. Retail businesses, houses of worship, swimming pools, indoor dining, nail salons, gyms and playgrounds will all reopen - with limitations.
- Montgomery County: Beginning today, Wheaton will launch a "<u>Streetery</u>" pilot to welcome additional socially distanced dining.
- Virginia: Phase Three <u>guidelines</u> to lift additional public health restrictions were released. The Commonwealth does not yet have a targeted date for entering Phase Three.
- Fairfax County: An <u>information sheet</u> for older adults and people of any age with underlying medical conditions are at higher risk for severe illness from COVID-19 was released.
