II. DEVELOPMENTS OF NOTE

- City of Alexandria: All southbound lanes of I-395 at mile marker 2.5 are closed due to a fatal collision accident. To VA-236 Traffic is being diverted to Duke Street
- District of Columbia: Metro train service was suspended between Stadium-Armory (Blue and Orange Lines) and Capitol Heights Stations due to smoke along the track of the Capitol Heights Station. All stations are open.
- District of Columbia: A Heat Emergency is in effect for the District. <u>Cooling centers</u> are available throughout the city.

 Prince George's County: Transit riders are encouraged take the county's online <u>transportation option survey</u>. Shared experiences will help develop and prioritize projects to improve the transportation system.

III. COVID-19 (CORONAVIRUS)

- National Capital Region: There are 69,132 COVID-19 cases and 2,645 fatalities reported in the NCR. DC, MD, VA
- District of Columbia: All District employees must complete an <u>Employee Contact Tracing</u> <u>Training</u>. The training will create a District-wide understanding of strategies for the mitigation and containment of COVID-19.
- Maryland: The state has <u>surpassed the</u>
 <u>milestone</u> of 400,000 COVID-19 tests. The
 COVID-19 positivity rate has dropped to 8.4%
 and total current hospitalizations have fallen to
 their lowest level since April 13.
- Montgomery County: Additional <u>reopening</u> and <u>recovery guidance</u> was released for business owners.
- City of Alexandria: Modified full-day summer programs will be offered at several locations for children ages 6-12. Each program is designed with limited capacity to endure the safety of participants and prevent the spread of COVID-19.
- Loudoun County: The county's Medical Reserve Corps continues to <u>seek volunteers</u> to help support the public health response to COVID-19.
