


## NCR WATCH DESK

**SUNRISE BRIEF, JUNE 25, 2020** 

## I. WEATHER

 Today: Mostly cloudy. Scattered showers and thunderstorms, mainly after 3PM. Chance of precipitation is 40%. High 86°. Low 66°.



 Hazardous Weather Outlook: An isolated severe thunderstorm is possible this afternoon and evening. The highest risk of a severe thunderstorm is south of I-66 and US-50.

## II. DEVELOPMENTS OF NOTE

- National Capitol Region: The Woodrow Wilson Memorial Bridge will be opening for maintenance today at 11:30PM until Friday, June 26 at 1AM. Motorists should anticipate delays.
- Prince George's County: Police is seeking the public assistance in locating 27-year-old Todd Burge, who was last seen at 2:30AM in the 6300 block of Armand Boyd Way.

## III. COVID-19 (CORONAVIRUS)

- Overview: Johns Hopkins University reports 9,440,535 COVID-19 cases, 482,923 deaths, and 4,754,755 recoveries worldwide as of 6AM. In the US, there are 2,381,369 cases, 121,923 deaths, and 656,161 recoveries.
- National Capital Region: There are 77,738
   COVID-19 cases and 2,946 fatalities reported in the NCR. <u>DC</u>, <u>MD</u>, <u>VA</u>
- Nationwide: The CDC and FDA issued a joint statement regarding food export restricting pertaining to COVID-19. The two agencies reported that there is no evidence that people can contact COVID-19 from food packaging.
- Frederick County: Community members are urged to use the <u>Citizen Online Police</u> <u>Reporting System</u> to file or request reports.
- Prince George's County: All health department testing sites will be closed on Fridays, starting Friday, June 26. The Health Department is offering free COVID-19 testing by appointment only by calling the County's coronavirus hotline at 301-883-6627 between 8AM to 8PM.
- Alexandria: A married couple from Northern Virginia was arrested on June 20 for conspiracy to commit wire fraud after allegedly submitting false loan application in connection with the COVID-19 pandemic that resulted in the disbursement of over \$1.4 million in proceeds under the Paycheck Protection Program.
- Fairfax County: Families have two choices in how students will return to school for school year 2020-21. An enrollment letter will be distributed to parents so that they can state their preference.
