II. DEVELOPMENTS OF NOTE

National Capital Region: The Department of Defense will provide aerial, musical, and ceremonial support to this year's Salute to America celebration. Flyovers will begin in Boston, proceed to several cities, and join other aircrafts in the celebration over the District.

III. COVID-19 (CORONAVIRUS)

- **Overview:** Johns Hopkins University reports 10,302,867 COVID-19 cases, 505,518 deaths, and 5,235,908 recoveries worldwide as of 6AM. In the US, there are 2,590,582 cases, 126,141 deaths, and 705,203 recoveries.
- National Capital Region: There are 79,562 COVID-19 cases and 3,033 fatalities reported in the NCR. DC, MD, VA
- Nationwide: TSA officers will ask travelers to place their boarding pass on the reader and briefly adjust their mask during ID verification at airports.

- Nationwide: A digital screening tool that streamline Veteran access to medical care during the pandemic was released. The screening tool will enable more than 10,000 people a day.
- Maryland: The Governor and State Superintendent announced \$210 million in additional funding to help local school systems address the learning gap and digital divide.
- Prince George's County: Department of Parks and Recreation announced additional amenities will be available for residents and visitors as the Department gradually reopens its facilities to the public.

- Virginia: All residents are encouraged to respond and engage with legitimate contact tracing calls and emails while remaining vigilant against scams. Calls from contact tracers will read "VDH COVID Team." Contact tracers will not ask for a Social Security Number of bank details.
- Loudoun County: There has been an increase in the number of positive tests among residents 29-years-old and younger over the past week. Health officials will examine these cases to determine the cause of the increase among the younger population.
