II. DEVELOPMENTS OF NOTE

National Capital Region

 Prince George's County: A man was stabbed during a fight outside a Popeyes in Oxon Hill over the chain's popular fried chicken sandwich. The fight began inside after someone cut in line and it escalated outside. This past summer, angry customers have threatened restaurant workers and filed lawsuits against the chain over the sandwich shortage. Link

United States

- Ohio: A Dayton police detective was shot while serving a drug-related search warrant. A large amount of fentanyl along with cash and weapons were found in the home. Five people are reportedly in custody. Link
- Colorado: A 27-year-old alleged white supremacist has been charged with plotting to blow up a state synagogue. Federal investigators reached out to the suspect in September after he promoted racially motivated acts of violence on Facebook. There were 2,000 incidents involving anti-Semitism reported in 2017, which is considered the worst year on record. Link

 Maryland: A two-alarm fire at an auto body shop in Baltimore caused the building to partially collapse. Two firefighters suffered nonlife threatening injuries. The cause of the fire is under investigation. Link

World

- Mexico: At least five US citizens have been killed and another 15 are missing in an attack in the Mexican border state of Sonora, which has been attributed to drug cartels. The federal Department of Security and Citizens' Protection has reinforced security following, "reports about disappearances and aggression against several people." <u>Link</u>
- India: A grenade attack in the city of Srinagar killed one person and injured at least 45 others. The attack happened five days after a driver was killed and a grenade injured 20 others at another location. Officials said this is the bloodiest incident since New Delhi on August 5. Link
- Iraq: At least five people have been killed and 60 others wounded in a new round of clashes between anti-government protestors and security forces. Protestors threw rocks and set fires while security forces flooded the area to protect government buildings when gunfire began. Since early October, security forces have killed more than 260 people in a wave of protests. Link
