II. DEVELOPMENTS OF NOTE

National Capital Region

- **District of Columbia:** A 49-year-old California woman was arrested near the White House Visitor Center for possession of a destructive device and dangerous weapon, a crossbow and arrows. The items were found inside the woman's vehicle. It is unclear why she was in the District or at the White House. [Link](#)

United States

- **Virginia:** Citizens were urged to shelter in place after a shooting in a Walmart parking lot that injured two people in Warrenton, VA. The shooting happened after a confrontation in the lot on James Madison Highway which prompted a large police presence. Police report two suspects are in custody and two are at large. [Link](#)
- **Georgia:** US Customs seized 2,133 pounds of cocaine worth \$31 million, considered the largest seizure ever at the port of Savannah. The container was being shipped from South America to Europe. In 2018, an average of 4,657 pounds of narcotics was seized by CBP agents daily across the US. [Link](#)

World

- **Tajikistan:** Seventeen people were killed in an attack on an outpost on the Tajik-Uzbek border. Officials are placing blame on Islamic State group jihadists who had crossed over from Afghanistan. The area has been closed off and armed checkpoints have been set up in other parts of the country. - **Nigeria:** Two separate fires broke out at Balogun, one of the country's largest markets in central Lagos. The fires had engulfed five-story buildings on the edge of the market. It is unclear how the fire started. In March, a similar incident killed 20 people when a building collapsed. [Link](#)
- **Thailand:** An attack at a security checkpoint killed 15 and injured four others in the Yala province. The attack is considered the worst in years in a region where thousands were killed by a Muslim separatist insurgency. The area has been closed off and under investigation. There has been no immediate claim of responsibility for the attack. [Link](#)

- **Syria:** The US Department of State reissued a Level 4 travel advisory due to terrorism, kidnapping, and armed conflict which pose significant risk of death or serious injury as US citizens remain a target. Emergency services to US citizens are limited due to the lack of permanent consular presence. [Link](#)
