## II. DEVELOPMENTS OF NOTE

## **National Capital Region**

- Prince George's County: All north and southbound lanes of Baltimore Avenue/US-1 were closed at the Inter-County Connector/MD 200 due to a fatal vehicle crash for three hours. All lanes have reopened.
- District of Columbia: The US Coast Guard Station Washington (USCG) will conduct boat tactics training this morning from 6AM-9AM. The training will take place at the Upper Potomac River between Arlington Memorial Bridge and 14th Street Bridge. USCG will utilize orange Coast Guard boats, with flashing blue lights, simulating a security zone around a high value asset. There will be no live fire or blanks used during this training. This is only a tactics and maneuvering drill. There will be a broadcast to notify mariners to exercise caution in the area for the duration of the exercise.

## **United States**

- New York: A coast-to-coast storm system has affected travelers returning home from the Thanksgiving holiday with thousands of flight cancellations and hundreds of delays. As the storm travels east, some states will see a foot of snow. Forecasters expect New York to receive up to three to five inches of snow today. The governor has placed the National Guard on standby as critical infrastructure may be affected. Link
- Texas: Three people have died after a singleengine plane crashed during an emergency landing in San Antonio. The plane developed engine problems after leaving Sugar Land and heading to Boerne, Texas. The plane was found wrecked on the sidewalk and street. The crash is under investigation. <u>Link</u>

## World

 Mexico: A gunfight between suspected cartel members and security forces left 19 dead and six others injured in the town of Villa Union, 40 miles south of the US border town of Eagle Pass, Texas.
