

II. DEVELOPMENTS OF NOTE

National Capital Region

District of Columbia: Police are asking the public for help in finding a 16-year-old girl and her 6-month-old son who have been missing since Friday. The mother and son were last seen on Girard Street NW. in Columbia Heights on Friday around 1PM. Police are asking anyone with information to call (202) 727-9099, or Youth and Family Services. Link

United States

Hawaii: Two police officers were killed responding to a stabbing inside a home near Waikiki Beach. The suspect opened fire as police arrived and set fire to the home, which spread to several other homes. The suspect died in the fire. Link

Virginia: The FBI and local law enforcement are working together regarding threats of violence for the gun rights rally in Richmond today. Federal authorities arrested several suspects around the country this week out of concern they were planning violent acts at the rally. The threats, considered credible by law enforcement, come from mainstream chat channels and alternative dark web sites used by violent groups and white nationalists from outside of Virginia. Governor Northam is extending the state of emergency into Tuesday evening. Link

World

- **Germany:** An intelligence report warns of a potential attack against US troops located at Tower Barracks in Grafenwohr or Tower Barracks in Dulmen. Both barracks remain at Force Protection Condition Level Bravo, which applies when an increased threat of terrorist activity exists. German and US officials were consulted, and no imminent threat is found to exist. Link
- **China:** Officials reported 139 new cases of the SARS-like virus within 48 hours. Majority of the cases have been detected in Wuhan, but have spread to other major Chinese cities, and three other Asian countries. The total number of cases now exceeds 200. Link
