
SUNRISE BRIEF, JULY 9, 2020

I. WEATHER

• **Today:** Partly sunny. Light east wind increasing to 5 to 9 mph High 90°. Low 74°.



• Adverse Weather: The National Hurricane Center is monitoring an area of low pressure along the coast of South Carolina for tropical or subtropical development. Heavy rain, flooding, and gusty winds are possible along coastal sections of the Carolinas, Mid-Atlantic and Northeast the next few days.

II. DEVELOPMENTS OF NOTE

National Capital Region: Metro released a Return to Work online survey to understand how individual's commuting patterns might have changed since working remotely. The survey will assist Metro in preparing transit services as the region gradually reopens and more employees return to work.

United States

California: Marine Corps Air Ground Combat
Center in Twentynine Palms was on lockdown
yesterday after reports of an active shooter. An
individual sustained a self-inflicted gunshot
wound at approximately 8:30AM. The
individual was transported to a medical facility.
No other injuries were reported.

III. COVID-19 (CORONAVIRUS)

- Overview: Johns Hopkins University reports 12,062,863 COVID-19 cases, 549,900 deaths, and 6,605,246 recoveries worldwide as of 6AM. In the US, there are 3,055,144 cases, 132,309 deaths, and 953,420 recoveries.
- National Capital Region: There are 83,048
 COVID-19 cases and 3,141 fatalities reported
 in the NCR. <u>DC</u>, <u>MD</u>, <u>VA</u>
- National: The U.S. Food and Drug
 Administration has <u>issued a warning letter</u> for
 clinical labs and health care providers over
 COVID-19 tests manufactured by Becton,
 Dickinson and Company.
- District of Columbia: Free antibody testing by appointment only available at two locations: Canal Park and Takoma Recreation Center.
- District of Columbia: All DC Hospitals are ready and able to offer a full range of services and safely provide high quality care. The District of Columbia Hospital Association is urging the public to not delay medical treatment and that area hospitals have implemented a number of precautions to ensure a safe environment.
- Virginia: Fairfax County Public Schools will reopen schools this fall. Parents and guardians will have two enrollment options for their students and should make their choice by July 15.
