National Capital Region



National Capital Region

 District of Columbia: DC Health is partnering with the Centers for Disease Control to learn more about the spread of COVID-19 with a <u>serology survey</u>.



(DC Health COVID-19 Situational Update July 13)

- District of Columbia: DC Health is offering free <u>antibody testing</u> at three locations: Hillcrest Rec Center, Canal Park, and Takoma Rec Center.
- Maryland: The positivity rate is higher for Marylanders under the age of 35. State health officials report, as of July 12, the positivity rate among Marylanders under 35 is 6.46%, which is 83.5% higher than the positivity rate for Marylanders age 35 and older (3.52%).

- Montgomery County: Montgomery County's <u>Community Recovery Advisory Group</u> will host its first meeting on Tuesday, July 14, on Zoom.
- Prince George's County: All Public Safety
 Employees are now required to take a COVID 19 test to prevent spread through interacting
 with county residents during their work. To
 support the employee testing goal, the Sports
 & Learning Complex testing site will be closed
 for general public testing until July 31.
- Virginia: Governor Northam will hold a press conference to latest updates on the Commonwealth's response to COVID-19 today at 2PM.

United States

- Nationwide: Pfizer Inc and partner BioNTech SE said on Monday two of their <u>experimental</u> <u>coronavirus vaccines</u> received "fast track" designation from the U.S. Food and Drug Administration, speeding up the regulatory review process.
- California: Effective July 13, <u>California</u> closed some indoor business operations statewide to include restaurants, bars and breweries, wineries & tasting rooms, movie theaters, family entertainment centers, zoos and museums.

World

- Japan: All U.S. Marine Corps personnel on the Japanese island of <u>Okinawa</u> have had their movements restricted in an effort to combat the spread of COVID-19.
- Philippines: Reported Southeast Asia's biggest daily jump in COVID-19 deaths on Monday and warned of more fatalities ahead. The government and several large hospitals in the capital Manila said critical care capacity had been reached.
